Catherine McAuley's concern for the health of new born babies was shaped by an experience of finding a young child cradling an infant in her arms. They had been evicted from their basement room following the death of the child's parents and elder siblings from typhoid that morning.

Climate change poses a further serious risk to poverty reduction and threatens to undo decades of development effort. COSD


